I checked all the notice boards, which showcased all children's work; both pupils and staff have taken pride in each piece of work displayed, again demonstrating the ethos of the school.

The addition of the Forest school is an environment which allows pupils to play and learn, it develops skills outside the classroom to improve mental health and well-being in young minds and sets them up to be resilient in later life through problem solving and teamwork. This is a real asset to the school and I witnessed pupils undertaking activities in a safe environment that could not be replicated in a classroom and in speaking with these pupils I got a real sense that without this opportunity in school to explore and learn, they would not be as curious in the classroom asking questions as this experience allowed them to build confidence.

As a governor and parent to the school, the hard work and dedication of all staff at the school was exactly shown in the teaching and learning seen in the last two days. I feel proud to share this experience with all parents and would be delighted to thank all staff for their hard work just before the Easter break."
