Book Fair



PTA NEWS - PTA FUNDRAISERS

We are holding a fancy dress competition next Thursday 7 March for World Book Day when the children should come to school dressed as their favourite book character. There will be a parade in the hall in the afternoon and the winners will be chosen. Entry is £1 and proceeds all go to the PTA fund.







We are holding a non-uniform day on Friday 15 March and children should bring in an Easter Egg as a donation. These eggs will then be used at EASTER EGG BINGO which is on Friday 22 March at 6.30pm in the school hall. This is a great family fun occasion and we are grateful to Mr Mark Doney who has volunteered to be the Bingo Caller for the evening. Entry is free and bingo cards are £1 each. The children absolutely love this event but they must be accompanied by an adult. Families can bring their own drinks and snacks for the evening and be ready to get their eyes down for BINGO.....

The PTA fund has paid for wonderful resources over recent years, for example the laptops the children use for computing every week; chairs for the school hall for events; the outdoor classroom and pond; and developing our outdoor forest school area. Our next project is a polytunnel to be used to teach the children all about growing - its installation begins today. The PTA also approved plans to put a shelter on the back playground for the children who like to read or draw at playtimes to sit under, and also the purchase of some boxes of playtime resources.

The school also needs you to join the 100 club. For just £5 per month you have the chance to win one of two monetary prizes. Any profits from the 100 club go directly into PTA funds. Please consider joining this club. The details of how to join are as follows:

100 Club

The 100 Club is a regular source of fundraising for PTA funds, which are used to buy resources for the children in school. Recent purchases have included the new outdoor classroom.

How It Works

The prize money each month will be exactly 50% of the monies paid in by its members. The cost to enter is £5 a month, so for example, 100 members will generate £500 each month, this will provide £250 in prize money, 50 members will generate £125 in prizes.

Each month there will be 2 prizes in the ratio 60%:40%.

100 members will generate a: 1^{st} Prize - £150 & 2^{nd} Prize - £100. As you can see, the more people who join the 100 Club, the greater the prize money and therefore the greater the amount raised to enable the PTA to support all the pupils in the school.
